Jimmy Torano and Scott Stewart Share First Championship Honors at 2021 Upperville Colt & Horse Show

The 2021 Upperville Colt & Horse Show (UCHS) welcomed its 168th edition of elite hunter and jumper competition Monday, where the Performance Hunter divisions were highlighted in the Parker Hunter Ring. At the conclusion of the first day, it was Jimmy Torano and Scott Stewart who tied for champion in the Performance 3'6" Hunters aboard Isalou Inc's Laskano and Dr. Betsee Parker's For Always, respectively, receiving the Allen Smith Perpetual Trophy, donated by Mr. Bob Bell.

Jimmy Torano and Laskano, a 9 year-old Westphalian gelding, posted a high score of 87 in the first round of the Performance 3'6" Hunters, while Scott Stewart and For Always, a 7 year-old Oldenburg gelding, posted an impressive score of 88 to win the Performance 3'6" Hunter handy round. Each pair earned 10-points based on their rounds, creating a tie for the championship title. Both horses will continue showing tomorrow in the Green 3'6" Hunters and Green Confirmation Hunters, respectively.

Preceding the 3'6" division, the Parker Hunter Ring opened competition with the Performance 3'3" Hunter division, which was split into three sections, with the handy round and championship moved to Tuesday. Evan Coluccio claimed the over fences win in Section A aboard High Society and Section B aboard Philadelphia Story, both owned by the Lignelli Family. The highest score of the day was a 90 earned by Hunt Tosh in Section C, riding Chorus for Douglas Wheeler.

Professional hunter divisions at the Upperville Colt & Horse Show will continue Tuesday, June 8, beginning at 7:30 a.m. including the Green Hunter divisions which will feature the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stakes classes, offered at the 3' and 3'3" levels, in Hunter Ring II.

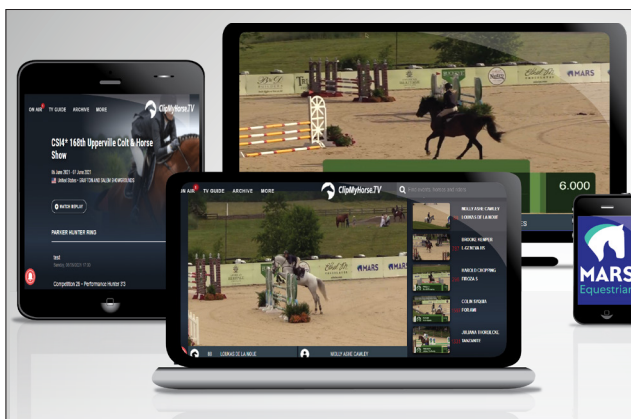

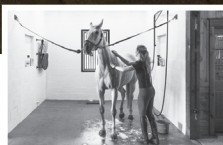

Talented Thoroughbreds and Young Stars Take Center Stage on Opening Day of Upperville Colt & Horse Show

Jumper action at the Upperville Colt & Horse Show (UCHS) was highlighted Monday, June 7, by the TAKE2 Thoroughbred Jumper class, where 17-year-old Alyssa Paulette of Beaverdam, Virginia, captured the victory aboard When In Rome, an 8-year-old Thoroughbred gelding, in the HorseFlight Jumper Ring II. The pair cleared the first round and advanced to the jump-off to produce the only double-clear effort in 38.44 seconds.

The fastest jump-off time belonged to Kristiane Pellegrino and White Oaks Joyride, but a single rail cost them the win as they dashed through the timers in 27.83 seconds, settling for second place behind Paulette at the conclusion of the class. Martha Nevins and Classic Brother rounded out the top three, lowering the height of one obstacle during the jump-off and finishing in 32.83 seconds for the yellow rosette.

Monday's win was very special for Paulette, who just began showing Thoroughbred Jumpers this year with When In Rome, whom she has owned for six years. Paulette will continue competing in the TAKE2 Thoroughbred Jumpers during the 2021 UCHS, which will continue Tuesday, June 8. Her goal for the year is to qualify for the \$20,000 TAKE2 Thoroughbred Jumper Finas that will take place at the Kentucky National Horse Show this September, as well as the Zone 4 Championships in the High Child/Adult Jumpers.

Later in the day, young horses took center stage to close out the day with the Six-Year-Old Jumpers, sponsored by Sparky Frost and SHF Enterprises. Monday's winner was Silvio Mazzoni with Country Fox Farm's All Inn V/H Beeckhof Z, completing a double clear effort during the Power and Speed class. Trainer Paige Cade imported the Belgian Warmblood gelding six weeks ago and offered the ride on the young horse to Mazzoni.

Purchased as a resale horse, Mazzoni and Cade will continue to compete with the horse in the Six-Year-Old Jumpers while developing him for the top level of the sport. Mazzoni is looking forward to competing with the talented young gelding in the B&D Builders Arena Tuesday following the day's highlight event, which will be the NAYJDP Rising Star Stakes at 8 a.m.

The Upperville Colt & Horse Show is the oldest and one of the most prestigious horse shows in America. Established in 1853 by Colonel Richard Henry Dulany, who also founded the Piedmont Fox Hounds, the show was originally designed to encourage better treatment of young horses and improve the local breeding stock.

Colonel Dulany chose one of his properties, Grafton Farm, as the site for his competition. Adjacent to the original Winchester Turnpike, now Route 50, Grafton was known for its stately oak and tupelo trees, with good grass footing. Contacted by Dulany, Louis Tiffany designed the first silver trophy, donating his labor and craftsmanship. Since its inception, the Upperville Colt & Horse Show has grown tremendously and is now established as one of the signature horse shows on the local, national, and international yearly calendars.

Today, the show takes place over the first full week in June and includes more than two thousand horse and rider combinations. Prizes are awarded for in-hand hunter breeding conformation, and performance in both hunters and jumpers. Riders range from local children on their lead-line ponies to Olympic caliber horses and riders.
